# **Program Description**

## **Purpose**

The ADHD Academy is designed as a first step in learning about ADHD and includes strategies that may help parents and caregivers interact with the ADHD child. The program is designed to enlighten participants with general information about each topic. It is not intended as a substitute for professional treatment, counseling sessions or to provide specific guidance on individual children.

All classes are offered virtually from 6-8 p.m. (unless otherwise indicated)

## Registration fee

\$10 per participant per class, or \$15 for 2 adults per class attending together. Registration is required for all sessions.

## **Cancellation Policy**

Cancellations must be received two weeks prior to the class. At that time, refunds will be made, minus 30% for administrative costs. No refunds will be given after that time.

## **Behavior Management**

October 8, 2025

February 19, 2026

Why are behavioral strategies helpful? What are some effective behavioral strategies for ADHD? What are the limitations of behavioral strategies for ADHD? Join us as we explore these and other questions, as well as behavioral treatments and how they may help the child with ADHD be successful.

# **Stress Management**

October 16, 2025

Research has shown that parents of children with ADHD suffer high levels of stress, depression, anxiety, blame, and marital discord. These high levels, left untreated, can lead to health issues and negatively affect the quality of life for everyone. This session focuses on how parents can take good care of themselves.

#### Self-Esteem

Are you wondering how to help your child with ADHD have better self-esteem? In this class, we will expand and improve your understanding of how self-esteem develops, how ADHD may impact self-esteem, as well as learn ways to improve and support the self-esteem of the child with ADHD.

#### ADHD Goes to School

October 28, 2025

Why does ADHD cause so many problems in school? What are the most common academic problems that arise with ADHD? How does ADHD cause these academic problems? What can we do to help kids with these problems? School can be a significant challenge for the child who has ADHD. Join us in identifying the most common academic performance problems that arise, why they occur and what we can do to promote success at home and in the classroom.

#### **Medications**

November 12, 2025

February 26, 2026

Parents often have questions about medications for ADHD and may be apprehensive about using medications for treating ADHD in their child. This session offers an in-depth discussion on the physiology of ADHD, the variety of medication options available for treating ADHD and how they function.

## **Social Skills**

November 18, 2025

April 14, 2026

Children with ADHD often have difficulties with personal interactions. In this course, we will discuss ADHD behaviors and how they may impact social skill development. We will also help parents identify areas for improvement in their own child and examine practical strategies to help parents encourage and reinforce positive social skill development.

#### Alternative Treatments... What's in the News

May 21, 2026

While prescription medications and behavioral management are the cornerstone to effective treatment for ADHD, parents often wonder if nonconventional or alternative treatments can also be effective. Join us as we explore those alternative treatments and learn what works, what doesn't and what's unknown.

# What is This Thing Called ADHD?

Our behavioral health staff will help your child understand what ADHD is and how/when it might affect them the most, identify who their "team" is and how they can work together with their team to facilitate a more positive result. *This class is for children ages 8-12, with ADHD only. All children must be accompanied by an adult.* 

## **Just for Siblings**

October 18, 2025, from 9-10:30 a.m. — Westerville *Close to Home*<sup>SM</sup> May 2, 2026, from 9-10:30 a.m. — Westerville *Close to Home*<sup>SM</sup>

Do you ever get upset with your brother or sister? Do you wonder why they get "all the attention?" This session is designed to help school-age siblings better understand what the deal is with ADHD, why their siblings act the way they do, and what they can do to help the situation for themselves and their family. This class is for children ages 8-12, who have a sibling with ADHD only. The child with ADHD should not attend this class. All children must be accompanied by an adult.
