Title: Kindergarten Readiness/ Health Literacy



Educational Objectives:

1. Explain why shared reading is important to childhood development.
2. Recognize factors that increase the practice of shared reading at home.
3. Identify programs and resources within the community that promote literacy development in youth.
4. Explain why developing early literacy can promote positive health outcomes and kindergarten readiness.
5. Assess the impact promoting and interacting with programs like Reach Out & Read (ROR) and Ohio Governor's Imagination Library (OGIL) can have on providers.

Ezekiel (Zeke) Hartman, MD, is originally from Lanark, IL. He received his undergraduate degree (BA) in Biology with a minor in Ethics from Augustana College (Rock Island, IL) in 2015. He completed his medical degree from the University of Illinois-Rockford in 2019.

He will complete his residency in June 2022 at Nationwide Children's Hospital and enter primary care pediatrics in Lancaster, OH. Reading has always been a passion for him and finding ways to promote childhood literacy through work with the OGIL and in other clinical work has been a way to extend that passion to the next generation.

Gabriella Gonzales, MD, received her undergraduate degree (BS) in Science Pre-professional Studies and Minor in Theology from the University of Notre Dame in 2015. She earned her medical degree in 2019 from The Ohio State University and is currently a third-year pediatrics resident at NCH. Next year she will be starting her Sports Medicine fellowship at NCH/Ohio State. Her interest in literacy was largely influenced by her mother, a former elementary school teacher, who emphasized the importance of reading at home and by her experiences working with ESL Hispanic immigrant families both during and prior to residency. She plans to continue to promote literacy, especially health literacy, during her career.

Alexander Rakowsky, MD, is an associate program director for the General Pediatrics Residency program and a resident continuity clinic preceptor and clinic lead at the Olentangy Primary Care Center. His academic work focuses on both medical education innovations and on advocacy. Regarding advocacy he is one of the leads for the residency advocacy curriculum and advanced competency, with particular interest in food insecurity and literacy development. Growing up with a dad who immigrated to the US from Ukraine and who spent his professional career as a linguist dedicated to promoting literacy among recently arrived immigrant families, Dr. Rakowsky has a passion for this topic and he would like to dedicate this presentation to the memory of his father.
