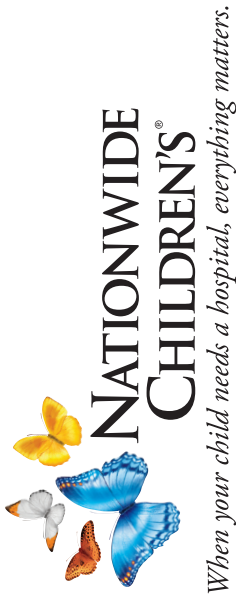
Cancellation Policy
