Cancellation Policy

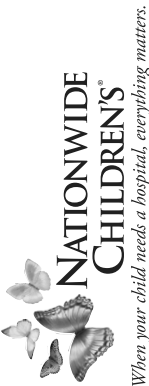

Intended Audience
