Autism Academy Webinars 2020

Program Description

The Autism Academy provides educational webinars for parents of children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). These sessions are open to anyone in the community interested in knowing more about autism. The program is not designed to replace ongoing treatment nor can it be geared to the specifics of individual children.

Filling in the Gaps: Planning for School Breaks

April 21

Webinar will emphasize proactive preparation for school breaks. Families will learn about different ways to structure their child's leisure time and the various community resources that are available to them.

Behavior Management for ASD: An Overview of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and How It Can Be Used to Address Problem Behaviors

May 19

This presentation will include an overview of ABA techniques and how they are used to manage and modify problem behaviors in the home and/or classroom. Community members will learn evidence based identification, assessment, prevention and intervention strategies that maintain and enhance the well-being of individuals with behavior problems.

Autism 101: Helping Others Understand ASD

June 16

This presentation will provide an overview of ASD diagnosis, symptoms, and treatments. This session will also provide strategies and tips of how to explain ASD to other people in your child's life.

ASD and Mental Health

July 21

This presentation will review mental health concerns that are common in individuals with ASD. It will focus on treatment options for various mental health diagnoses and describe possible challenges related to ASD that could impact treatment.

Collaborating with Schools and Navigating IEPs

August 18

This presentation will help families navigate through IEPs and learn about their rights while collaborating with their school team. Whether your child already has an IEP or you are just starting the process, this talk will help you understand rationale, the IEP process, components of the IEP, and your rights as a parent of a child with a disability.

Puberty and Transition to Adult Services

September 16

This presentation will provide a basic overview of changes during puberty and suggestions for navigating teenage behaviors. This session will also explore the steps needed, services and resources to help families prepare for their child's transition out of high school.

Encouraging Social Interaction: Preschool to School-Age

October 20

This presentation will provide an overview of key areas of social development across different ages. It will give general strategies for facilitating successful play-dates, community outings, and extracurricular activities.

Family Functioning and the Role of Typically Developing Siblings

November 17

The class will address common caregiver concerns related to parenting a child with ASD and their siblings. Discussion will focus on general family functioning and issues related to sibling and parenting factors. **Note: this session is intended for parents and adult caregivers only.*
