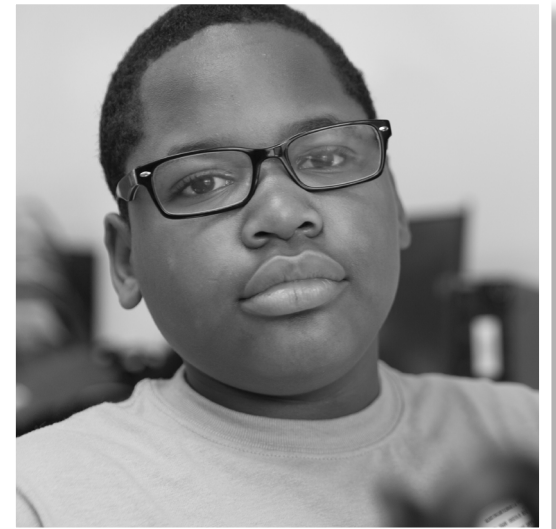

Autism Academy Webinars 2022

Webinars are from 5:30 to 7 p.m.

Program Description

The Autism Academy provides educational webinars for parents of children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD). These sessions are open to anyone in the community interested in knowing more about autism. The program is not designed to replace ongoing treatment nor can it be geared to the specific needs of individual children.

Toilet Training

March 15

Toilet Training is a major developmental achievement but one that is often hard for individuals with ASD. This class will discuss evidenced-based strategies to support children and families in successfully meeting this milestone.

Mental Health and ASD

April 19

This class will review mental health concerns that are common in people with ASD. We will discuss treatment options for various mental health diagnoses and describe possible challenges related to ASD that could impact treatment.

Supporting People with ASD: Coping with Grief and Loss

May 17

Grief and loss may include death, divorce and illness. This program will discuss ways caregivers can navigate discussions of grief and loss. It will also explore ways to cope and activities that can help manage grief.

Crisis Management and Police Interactions

June 21

This class will provide information about preparing for crises, identifying crisis support and alternatives to calling the police, and preparing for possible interactions with the police.

Bullying

July 19

Bullying and cyberbullying are pervasive problems amongst youth. It is of special concern for those with ASD. This presentation will provide general information about bullying, its modalities, its effects on victims as well as ways to increase your awareness of these behaviors.

Collaborating With Schools and Navigating IEPs

August 16

This class will help families navigate the Evaluation Team Report (ETR) and Individualized Education Program (IEP) process while working with their school team. Whether your child already has an IEP or you are just starting the process, this presentation will help you understand the evaluation process, components of the IEP and your rights as a parent of a child with a disability.

Behavior Management

September 20

This program will provide an overview of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) and how it can be used to address problem behaviors in younger and older children. It will include an overview of ABA techniques and how to use them to manage and modify problem behaviors in the home and/or classroom. Community members will learn evidence-based ways to identify, assess, prevent and intervene that maintain and enhance the well-being of those with behavioral problems.

Puberty and Transition

October 18

This class will provide a basic overview of changes during puberty and suggestions for navigating teenage behaviors. It will also explore the steps needed, services and resources to help families prepare for their child's transition out of high school.

Autism 101: Helping Others Understand ASD

November 15

This class will focus on a general understanding of ASD, the impact of the disorder, and general information about interventions. It will include ways to help others such as family members, peers, and school personnel better understand ASD. Attendees will learn about factors to consider when talking about the diagnosis to a child with ASD.

The live interactive format will allow you to watch and listen to a presentation, followed by a live question and answer period with the presenter in the comfort of your own home or office.
